## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Partners in Ministry,

There is no better way to begin a New Year than to gather for worship with sisters and brothers in Christ. Sunday, January 1, 2012, is an opportunity to praise God and give thanks for the gifts of life, love, and relationships. We exist only because God has created us. We have the promise of Eternal Life only because the Babe of Bethlehem grew up to give his life as the ultimate act of love.

It is in response to this act of love that we not only worship, but also share that love with others. God's love is an inclusive love, which ignores no one. God's love is a healing love, which brings together people who may seem different on the outside but who are all children of God. God's love is an empowering love, which can help us erase prejudice and hate from our lives so that we can make the world a better place, one small step at a time.

January 6<sup>th</sup>, the Festival of Epiphany, is a reminder of this all-inclusive love. Two thousand years ago, there were very strict lines drawn between people. Jesus' family and a group from the area which is known today as Iraq would not have interacted on any level. Part of the

miracle of the Epiphany story is that these stargazers, known as Magi or Wise Men, sought out a tiny Jewish child and were welcomed into his presence. They brought gifts, and the gifts were not only accepted, but treasured.

One of the things that I appreciate about St. Peter's one-of-a-kind Crèche is that the artist chose to expand the inclusivity of the Magi figures, depicting one as Middle Eastern, one as African, and one as Asian. People of all cultures and ethnicities – in fact, from all walks of life – are brought together at the Manger.

As we begin our journey through 2012, let us pray that the world, the Church, our congregation, and each of us might be less prejudiced and judgmental and more loving and forgiving.

Women of the ELCA Bible Study will meet at 9:30 AM on Tuesday, January 3 and January 17. All women are welcome to attend.

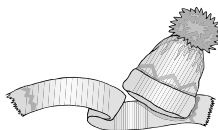

### **Pastor's Discretionary Fund**

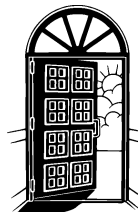
